


Dr. Rani Kankate

Sir also explained the benefits of being NAAC accereditated i.e it helps the institution identify its weaknesses, strengths, opportunities, and threats using a continuous evaluation process also it helps to understand the need for planning in the internal areas and allocating resources.

Researcher, National Centre for Cell Science (NCCS), Pune

Dr. Aniket Mali explained important steps in New Drug discovery and Translational Research. He also explained the importance of biotechnology in field of Pharmaceutical Research.

He explained that Different branches of science are expanding very fast and there are vast volumes of new information which are progressively discovered and added to the present human knowledge. With no doubt, pharmaceutical sciences is amongst the most dynamic disciplines of science that its content is attributed to different basic and applied researches including studies in the field of physical and organic chemistry, engineering, biochemistry, biology, pharmacology and pharmacotherapy. These researches are aimed to understand how to develop new drugs, optimize their delivery to the body and translate these integrated understanding into new therapies against human disease as well as improved community health.

He explained different biotechnological skill set in detail along with their applications in pharma research viz. Tissue Culture. Tissue culture is one of the most widely used techniques in any biological or biomedical research lab, PCR, Gel Electrophoresis, Western Blot, ELISA, Molecular (Gene) Cloning, Flow Cytometry, and confocal microscopy. The session was very informative for participants.








